




# Book Suggestions

What will await him? And all the while, how can he be sure that they won't catch up with him... This is the remarkable story of David's introduction to the world: sea, mountains and flowers, the colours of Italy, the taste of fruit, people laughing and smiling, all are new to David. David learns that his polite manner, his haunted eyes and his thin features are strange to other people. He must learn to fend for himself in this strange new world. This is The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas meets Jonathan Safran Foer for children. It is an incredible story of survival against all odds and self-discovery.*

**Peter Dickinson**



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### **My Sister Lives on the Mantelpiece**



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### **Private Peaceful**




**Michael, M.B.E. Morpurgo**
