- Children are encouraged to keep on trying, showing determination when faced with challenges.
- Mistakes at home are seen something to learn from.
- Parents model resilience by demonstrating positive attitudes, growth mindset and perseverance.
- Parents show ongoing commitment to encouraging, enthusing and motivating children and staff to show determination and perseverance in their work.
- Parents show commitment to support and work in partnership to achieve goals.

- Work is shared with parents via parents meetings or open days.

- Open teacher/parent/child relationships are established.
- There is regular communication between governors and staff.
