
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#### Spring Term - Welcome Back

Welcome back and welcome to what promises to be another fabulous term here at St Joseph's. All the children have settled back into their classes and are focused, pleased to be with their friends again and embracing their learning.

#### Attendance

You will have seen in my letter yesterday that we are launching our St Joseph's attendance campaign this term. We are aiming for a whole school target of 97%, recognising that children cannot help being ill. We have relaunched our Classopoly initiative and have introduced an Attendance Lottery that all the children are very excited about. Classopoly is based (loosely) on the Monopoly board game. All teachers have their own square. Every month the class with the highest attendance get to roll the Classopoly dice. If it lands on a particular teacher's square, they get a 20-minute treat with that teacher. For example, Nicholson Drive might result in hot chocolate and marshmallows with Mr Nicholson or Manners Mead might mean making your own paper aeroplane and flying them on the school field with Miss Manners. Every week children have the opportunity to be entered into the Attendance Lottery. If a child achieved 97% or above attendance for that week their name will be entered into the draw. The children get the opportunity to receive a lottery ticket every week but only if their attendance hits 97% or above. The more tickets the children win, the



greater chance they will have of winning at the end of the half term. Each half term we will draw the Attendance Lottery giving the children the opportunity to win a book token and breakfast with Mrs Walker. We will still continue with our termly 100% attendance certificates but want to raise the profile of how important your child's attendance is. We know holidays are cheaper in term time and we know many of our families have relatives abroad. However, we have to consider the stark reality that children who have positive attendance habits achieve higher and make greater progress when compared with pupils who have regularly been taken out of class for extended periods of time. There is a clear correlation between children who have poor attendance habits and children's GCSE results - please enter this into a google search at your leisure to read the government statistics. We can only teach those children who attend the lesson. I know we have very supportive parents who fully support their child's education and ensure they are regularly attending school. This is why we want to acknowledge this through targeting 97% attendance and above. Habits and expectation formed in Primary school will have an impact on their secondary education. If the expectation is that we visit relatives either side of the Easter holiday, that is lost learning that will never be recovered. Please read the statistics for yourselves as your child's education is too important to ignore the facts. I am very happy to chat to any parent that would like further details about the research surrounding attendance. Please do get in touch if you are finding getting your child into school a struggle. This is all about working together to allow your child to reach their full potential not about cheap holidays. If you get in touch with us, we chat through any of the difficulties you are having, we do understand and I promise we will help. However, I think we should celebrate the first full week of 2023 by congratulating St Joan class for having the highest attendance 99% - That is quite a few children now entered in the Attendance Lottery - you've got to be in it to win it!

#### **Reporting Absences**

Please can we remind parents that all absence, whether for illness or medical appointments or any other reason, should be reported to the school via Studybugs. Studybugs is a free app and all reported absence goes directly into the register and keeps class teachers informed of the reason for your child's absence. We have a legal duty to ascertain the whereabouts of all children. By reporting all absences, it prevents office staff from having to ring and email parents to find out the reason for them not being at school and avoids unnecessary home visits. Please remember to report absences daily, your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
