Lent

Last week we came together as a school in St Paul's Church to celebrate the start of Lent, with our Ash Wednesday service. Lent is a time of reflection where the Church asks us to prepare for Christ's passion and resurrection by making small sacrifices, traditionally in the form of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We continued to journey through Lent this week by sharing the book The Promise by Nicola Davies. If you are not familiar with the book you can share the story with your child via the following YouTube link: https://youtu.be/ynMTWupOQJ4 The story focuses on how a young girl is asked to keep a promise by looking after some acorns, and then goes onto to change her behaviour and become a better person by planting acorns throughout her city. As a take away task from this week's assembly, every pupil has been given a symbolic acorn to make their very own Lenten promise. We will be reflecting on how we can all grow as we journey though Lent. We will make every child's acorn a focus of a whole school display and watch how out Lenten tree grows as every member of the St Joseph's family plants their individual acorn. If you would like to give something back this Lent, we have set up a cost of living fund on ParentPay. This fund will be used to supplement any educational initiative or trips that a family might not be able to afford due to financial pressures. 


Please can we remind parents that all absence, whether for illness or medical appointments or any other reason, should be
