What Makes St Joseph's Exceptional?

A big thank you to all the parents who responded to our recent survey. The feedback is proving very useful. We will provide a more detailed report on the survey outcomes over the coming weeks but I wanted to share some of the wonderful comments that have been very much appreciated. We are an oversubscribed school with extensive waiting lists in every year group. This is because of the exceptional provision received by all our children. A sentiment echoed by so many parents 'We are very blessed with the teachers and staff at St. Joseph's, they are the best' another parent stated 'St Joseph's is not just a school, it's a community where I feel very



supported and listened to.' A theme running throughout the survey was how highly staff were thought of for their care, commitment, hard work and talent in the classroom. One parent recognised this as 'Dedicated staff and leadership who are responsive to needs.' We often describe St Joseph's like being part of a family. Our school was summarised by one parent as a 'warm, welcoming, friendly and nurturing school, a perfect starting point for children's academic journey.'

Please don't wait for a parent survey before getting in touch. I have an open-door policy and can be contacted via email if you don't do the school run. St Joseph's is a high achieving school because we work with the first educators of your child, you, the parents. Positive Behaviour

The best schools don't stand still. They are continually striving for excellence and are outwardly facing. This is exactly why we are in the process of reviewing our behaviour policy. The current behaviour policy is perfectly fine but was introduced when I first joined St Joseph's. The governor's and I want our behaviour policy to reflect current educational theory. Medicines in School

If we hold medication in school for your child, please remember that it is your responsibility to check expiry dates with the school office. Particularly Epipens and asthma inhalers. If your child requires antibiotics or any other medication, we can only administer if your child requires it 4 times or more in a school day. All medication MUST come to the school office in its box with the information leaflet enclosed.



NUTS & SESAME

Please remember we have a NO nut or Sesame policy in school. This includes sandwich fillings such as Nutella / Peanut Butter and dips such as hummus. We have several children with severe nut and sesame allergies who are at risk of anaphylactic shock.

Polite Reminder

A polite reminder of the following:

- No extreme haircuts or hair dye *
- Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories should be black, white or royal blue.
- Children can only wear a watch and small plain earring studs (in pierced ears). No other jewellery is allowed, for safety reasons.
- No make-up, no nail polish and no transfer tattoos.

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Summer Uniform



A reminder that all children should now be in summer uniform (unless the weather takes a turn for the worse!) - not a mixture of summer and winter. Our uniform leaflet is available on the school website under the 'Parents' tab. We would recommend that

during hot weather, children have a sun hat and that sun cream is applied before school. Staff are NOT allowed to apply sun cream. If you have any questions regarding our uniform policy, please speak to Mrs Walker.

By reporting all absences, it prevents office staff from having to ring and email parents to find out the reason for them not being at school and avoids unnecessary home visits. Please remember to report absences daily, your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
