

The curriculum is divided into three stages:

- 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7
- 3. Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11



Early Years

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on the Government's Early Learning Goals with seven areas of learning:

Every year, elections take place for the role of Head Boy and Head Girl and their deputies. Inclusion

Special Education Needs

We believe that all children need to feel safe, happy and valued at school in order to learn, progress and develop their well-being. We recognise the individuality of all children and the fact that they are at different levels of development, physically, emotionally, intellectually and socially. Staff recognise the need for differentiation in setting tasks for their pupils. The teaching staff who identify a particular pupil who is experiencing a problem consult with the Special Needs Co-ordinator and Headteacher. Discussion then follows outlining the best way of meeting the pupils' needs, using resources from within school, or centrally funded advice.

Regular reviews are held between the Special Needs Co-ordinator, class teacher, Headteacher and parents.

Gifted and Talented

We recognise that all children are individuals with their own specific needs, gifts and talents.

Children who are identified as being exceptionally able or talented are monitored and provided with stimulating and enriching lessons appropriate to their needs. Children are given additional opportunities to develop holistically through challenge and activities.

Governors
